## Comparing Notes from the Underworld: Contributions of Psychoanalytic, Jungian and Neuroscience Visions of Dreaming

Like babbling water, the dream has long drawn philosophers of the spirit and mind to quiet reflection on its mysteries. In recent times, Jung and Freud brought the dream into modern understanding. They heralded the sleeper's visions as a privileged portal into what is most essential to the human experience, but disguised and unknown as the source. They turned their unravelings of nightly hallucinations into therapeutic instruments of royal stature. Since then, while the heirs of Freud and Jung have further pondered the meanings of the dream in the private solitude of their singular disciplines, the dream has been debunked and then resurrected in the works of neuroscientists.

The heart of this workshop will be to see where we can synthesize our separate languages into a more comprehensive view of dreaming and dream work. After all, the mind and its components like dreaming function on many levels with a unity of their own. We will initiate our pursuit by first illustrating the salient ideas of each discipline. We will go beyond seeing dreaming as a process owned by sleep, to seeing it as intricately woven into waking life, the psychotherapeutic encounter and emotional healing itself. Clinical material will illustrate the theory throughout.

**Charles Fisher, M.D.**, is a Training and Supervising Analyst and Vice Chair of the Psychoanalytic Training Division at the San Francisco Center for Psychoanalysis. A member of the adjunct faculty of the Depth Psychology program at Sonoma State University, he has extensively researched the relationship between dreams and religious experience.

**Barbara McSwain, M.S.W.**, is a psychoanalyst and social worker in private practice in Berkeley, CA. She is a training and supervising analyst as well as a faculty member at the San Francisco Center for Psychoanalysis where she has taught classes on dreaming. She is also a training and supervising analyst at the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California and the Oregon Psychoanalytic Center.
