When Everything Stays Inside

The focus on disturbances in food and eating, whether it takes the form of anorexia, bulimia, or obesity, displaces emotional pain and conflict from other more unconscious, terrifying issues. In the office we can often be surprised by the complexity in our patient's thinking, character and underlying fantasies.

This conference is designed to acquaint and provide support for the clinician working with patients who present with complex symptoms including obesity. Many eating disordered patients exhibit dissociated states that may also be associated with trauma. We will address the treatment of those patients who challenge us as clinicians. Dr. Fisk's paper will provide a brief overview of trauma in the context of eating disorders. Dr. Jones will present a paper entitled "Nobody Home: Emptiness and Eating at the Edge of Survival." The clinical discussion by Drs. Schiller and Otte will focus on the moment-to-moment transference and countertransference within the analytic dyad during an intensive treatment.
