In disorders of eating and thinking, we bear witness to disturbances of the body-mind connection and the process of making links and creating meaning. In response, many of us experience disturbing reactions when working with patients with eating disorders. Feelings of helplessness, fear, rage, confusion, or the wish to rescue these fragile patients, are but a few of the powerful feelings that may be aroused in the therapist or analyst during treatment. We may find ourselves acting in surprising ways when patients have difficulty using us or our interpretations or they become increasingly ill. This conference is designed to help us think together about our common counter-transference experience

Jeanne Harasemovitch will present a paper entitled "Food for Thought: Disorders of Eating and Thinking - In Search of a Plausible Self" that addresses transference/countertransference experience with patients who have not yet begun to inhabit body and mind. The clinical discussion by Elizabeth Simpson, Ann Martini and Mirta Oelsner will focus on countertransference during moment-to-moment interactions within the analytic dyad during an intensive treatment.
